MARTHA MASON HILL

In 1998, the daughters of the late Martha Mason Hill (1911 - 1985) established the Martha Mason Hill Memorial Foundation in her memory. Her story is that of many extraordinary women of her era who, in spite of their circumstances, managed to help their children rise to a better place in life. Many others were beneficiaries of her selflessness as well. She was often heard singing one of her favorite songs, "This Little Light of Mine," the words of which accurately described her life.

She practiced her faith, and was a very nurturing person whose kindness and consideration towards others knew no bounds. We will never know the full extent of her philanthropic work, for she was not prone to publicize or boast about her good deeds. We do know, however, that her loving and caring ways had a lasting impact on many people. She was admired and respected by those who knew her.

Among her many fine qualities was her strong belief in the value of education. She was honored at Virginia State University (then College) for ensuring that all 7 of her daughters attended the College where she worked as a housekeeper for 40 years. Two grandchildren she reared are also alumni. Her family continues her legacy through the Foundation.

SAMUEL A. GILLIAM

Married to the eldest daughter of Martha Mason Hill, Sam shared Mrs. Hill's Christian values and strong belief that education is the key to success. He was a loyal supporter of MMHMF, a generous donor and major fundraiser (he conducted a drive every year). He was a devoted family man, an active community volunteer, and an exceptional role model and mentor to an untold number of young people over the years. He was a decorated veteran, serving his country in war (Korea and Vietnam) and peace for 30 years, attaining the highest enlisted rank of Sergeant Major in the Army. A member of the Maryland and Virginia Birdies, he was an avid golfer. He was also a talented vocalist and sang at MMHMF Annual Awards Programs and faithfully with his church choir. He was a member of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, the Aberdeen Proving Ground Federal Credit Union Board of Directors, the V.F.W., the Lions Club and the Masonic Lodge.

He is remembered for his sense of humor, warm and caring disposition, and his contagious smile. He loved traveling around the world. Most of all, he loved spending time with his family. He wouldn't play golf on Saturdays because that was the day he faithfully visited his pride and joy: his grandchildren. The Foundation hopes to continue his legacy and spirit of caring about and serving others.

Directions to Golf Course:

From Richmond, take I-95 South to exit 62 (Route 288 North). Exit onto Iron Bridge Road East (Route 10). Go to the third traffic light and make a right onto Beach Road. Follow the road for one mile and make a left onto Nash Road. Proceed to the stop sign and make a right onto Woodpecker Road. Make an immediate left (about 50 yards) back onto Nash Road. Follow it to the stop sign and make a right onto River Road. Travel about two miles and bear left at the country store onto Ivey Mill Road. Pass the first Chesdin Landing entrance and make a left into the second entrance.
